ACTIVITY	
OBJECTIVE	 The primary objective of the Plastic Awareness Program conducted by City Engineering College's CSE students was to: Raise Awareness: Educate street vendors about the detrimental effects of plastic pollution on the environment and human health. Promote Sustainable Practices: Encourage the adoption of eco-friendly alternatives to single-use plastics. Provide Practical Solutions: Distribute paper bags made from recycled newspapers to street vendors, offering a sustainable alternative to plastic bags.
ACTIVITIES	 Students interacted with vendors to educate them about the harmful effects of plastic on the environment and human health, highlighting the importance of adopting eco-friendly alternatives. Distribution of Paper Bags: As part of the initiative, students made paper bags from old newspapers themselves. These eco-friendly bags were distributed among street vendors free of cost to encourage them to use these instead of plastic bags.
OUTCOMES	 Sustainable Practices: The program successfully introduced and promoted the use of paper bags made from recycled newspapers, reducing the reliance on single-use plastics in the local community. Community Involvement: The initiative fostered a sense of community involvement, with students and vendors working together towards a common goal of environmental conservation.



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




Fig1&2. Students Distributing Paper Bags made from old Newspapers


FIG 2: Students Participation - A Section

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




Demonstration of Digital Payment Apps by students to villagers and farmers

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

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Day wise Report:

Day 1: Dengue Risk Awareness:

Children learned about Dengue as a serious illness spread by mosquitoes. They now recognize symptoms like fever and headaches and understand the importance of preventing mosquito bites by wearing protective clothing and using repellent.

Day 2: Awareness on Digital Literacy

Students learned about Computer basics cover such as understanding hardware (like the monitor, keyboard, and mouse), software (including operating systems and applications), and basic operations like file management, browsing the internet, and using common software programs such as word processors and spreadsheets.




FIG 2: Young Minds Engaged: Capturing the Spirit of National Youth Day

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




Fig 4. Students' participation in the Q&A
